PDA response to the earthquake in Haiti

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is pleased to announce that \$200,000 from funds designated for Haiti has been provided to the Hôpital Sainte Croix (Holy Cross Hospital) and the Faculte des Sciences Infirmiere l'Universite Episcopale d'Haiti (FSIL) nursing school in Leogane. In response to the earthquake, the FSIL nursing students have established 10 emergency care units throughout Leogane.

Funds from PDA will be used to purchase and provide the following for the hospital: electrical power and distribution systems, water pump, storage and distribution system, sanitary sewage lines and sewage containment and disposal system, diesel generator and fuel for diesel generators and vehicles.

The abundant generosity of shared blessings makes this possible. Thank you for your continued support.

\$10 Gift Cards

We use lots of gift cards. We include them in our food boxes for families. When we pack a box of non-perishable items, we add a gift card or two for perishable items such as milk, bread, meat, etc. We also use cards to purchase additional canned goods when we run out.

We do use discrepancy when handing out gift cards. If we need to, we will shop for the perishable items, rather than give a card to the family.

All families serviced through the Weekend Backpack Program and the Emergency Food Boxes are selected by the classroom teacher or guidance counselor.
