Louis Vierne was inspired to write this work after his second concert tour of England, playing at St. Mary's church in Hinckley, Leicestershire, where he heard the church's carillon play its very distinctive "tune." He develops it in his customary impressionistic Debussian style with heavy chromaticism and whole tone scales.
